




















How to book indoors

At Applause, we are passionate about bringing the very best, high-quality shows directly to your community! We understand the value of the arts in bringing communities together and we are always excited to welcome new hosts into the Applause family. Whether you've hosted 100 shows or this is your first, we are pleased to be working with you and we are here to help.

What is Applause?

We work with communities to help them host top quality professional touring productions and performers in their local venues and spaces. Whether it be a show for a village hall or an outdoor performance at your village fete or community celebration, Applause can help.

Being a Community Host

An Applause host can be an individual or voluntary group, parish council, village hall committee, school or publican - anyone invested in bringing social and creative opportunities to their community.

Our menu of events lists our **Sept 2023 – Feb 2024** season of touring shows available to book. An updated version will be available later in the year for the late Spring 2024 period.

Whilst many of our shows have general availability across the season, a small amount of the companies/performers dates are within limited touring periods. If you are interested in any of the following shows we would advise early booking to avoid disappointment:

Death Who's Coming To Dinner; Mountain Music; King of Nothing; Fairytales, Fables & Other Assorted Nonsense and Trio Partario.

We are here to help you decide, so do contact us and we can discuss what the best options are for your community space.

The Detail in 7 steps

We try to make hosting an event as easy as possible. We've listed the key steps for you below to give you an idea of what to expect and what you might want to think about:

- **1. Browse the menu.** Think about who you want to attract in the community, is it an adult audience, a show for families? Are you looking for music or for a theatre experience? Get in touch and let us know your preferences or for some advice about choosing.
- 2. Applause will liaise with the artists to agree dates and prepare contracts. For indoors shows, we work on a subsidy basis, whereby Applause pays the full price of the show to the performers and then the hosts pay us a contribution, made up of a Minimum Fee, plus 40% of ticket sales in excess of the Minimum Fee. The Minimum Fee is listed with each show in the menu.
- **3. Get everything ready.** We will put you in touch with the touring company so that you can make arrangements for event day, such as performer arrival times. Remember that your event will need to have the necessary licenses and insurance in place. We can help advise you on this.
- **4. Market the show.** Applause will be on hand to help make the show a success and have lots of handy tips on how to market your show. We will also supply you with a range of marketing materials.
- **5. Ticket sales.** We can support hosts in selling tickets through our online ticketing system on our website. Additionally, many hosts sell tickets in their local community and we can supply templates for physical tickets if this would useful. Recommended ticket prices are given on each show page as a guideline.
- 6. It's show time! On the day of the show we will ask you to help us collect some audience feedback (this is really important in helping us to secure our funding and continue to support shows like yours).
- 7. After the event. You will return a feedback form and we will invoice you for the relevant fee.

Lubna Kerr **Tickbox**

How did a Pakistani family cope arriving in a cold and wet 1960's Glasgow when no one had heard of a samosa.

Tickbox is a semi-autobiographical, one-woman play presented in English and Urdu. An immersive experience that combines theatre and storytelling, Tickbox tells of the journey of a middle class Pakistani family arriving in Glasgow, dealing with discrimination, racism and cultural barriers by using food and humour.

The themes of Tickbox are universal; migration, discrimination and unconscious bias. Everyone who migrates experiences discrimination and bias in some form but it's how we react to it that makes the difference.

Tickbox was recently shortlisted in the UK Asian Media awards and Lubna has just been nominated as Scottish Asian Women of the year.

Julian Gaskell & his Ragged Trousered Philanthropists **Broadside Bangers**


Cornwall's premium post-ragtime, rembetika punk, swing polka klezmer blues trio present a new anthology of some of the most melodramatic, gruesome and supernatural broadside ballads from the 17th to 19th centuries.

These popular ballads, selected from archives by Gaskell, cover everything from funeral arrangements to cat food and rural insurrection. They were printed and sung in the Georgian and Victorian eras but have lain unrecorded and largely unperformed for the last 100 years. Indeed, many of their tunes have been lost to time, and so the words have been rearranged and re-fitted with newly composed music on piano, accordions, violin, drums, bouzouki, bass, banjo and guitar.

Taking an alternate route from traditional folk styles, this show promises a wild and yet haunting journey through a murky past to a dark future and is sure to enthral, educate and entertain both the young and the old.


Django Reinhardt Songbook

For their 2023 UK-wide tour they present a compelling, evocative show in which violinist Tobie (Mozes Rosenberg, Antoine Boyer, Fapy Lafertin) and guitarist Cornelius (Noé Reinhardt, Daniel John Martin, Alan Barnes) visit the world of Django and his compadre Stephane Grapelli. The band, backed up by Sol Grimshaw on Rhythm Guitar and Marcus Penrose on Double Bass, explore the colourful mind and extraordinary music of the greatest European jazz musician by performing his landmark (and lesser known) compositions and telling stories of his fascinating life.




