
























How to book indoors

At Applause, we are passionate about bringing the very best, high-quality shows directly to your community! We understand the value of the arts in bringing communities together and we are always excited to welcome new hosts into the Applause family. Whether you've hosted 100 shows or this is your first, we are pleased to be working with you and we are here to help.

What is Applause?

We work with communities to help them host top quality professional touring productions and performers in their local venues and spaces. Whether it be a show for a village hall or an outdoor performance at your village fete or community celebration, Applause can help.

Being a Community Host

An Applause host can be an individual or voluntary group, parish council, village hall committee, school or publican - anyone invested in bringing social and creative opportunities to their community.

Our menu of events lists our Spring and Autumn/ Winter 25 season of touring shows available to book. While many of our shows have general availability throughout the season, some of the companies'/performers' dates are within limited touring periods. If you are interested in a specific act, we advise booking early to avoid disappointment.

The Detail in 7 steps

We try to make hosting an event as easy as possible. We've listed the key steps for you below to give you an idea of what to expect and what you might want to think about:

- 1. Browse the menu. Think about who you want to attract in the community, is it an adult audience, a show for families? Are you looking for music or for a theatre experience? Get in touch and let us know your preferences or for some advice about choosing.
- 2. Applause will liaise with the artists to agree dates and prepare contracts. For indoors shows, we work on a subsidy basis, whereby Applause pays the full price of the show to the performers and then the hosts pay us a contribution, made up of a Minimum Fee, plus 40% of ticket sales in excess of the Minimum Fee. The Minimum Fee is listed with each show in the menu.
- 3. Get everything ready. We will put you in touch with the touring company so that you can make arrangements for event day, such as performer arrival times. Remember that your event will need to have the necessary licenses and insurance in place. We can help advise you on this.
- **4. Market the show.** Applause will be on hand to help make the show a success and have lots of handy tips on how to market your show. We will also supply you with a range of marketing materials.
- 5. Ticket sales. We can support hosts in selling tickets through our online ticketing system on our website. Additionally, many hosts sell tickets in their local community and we can supply templates for physical tickets if this would useful. Recommended ticket prices are given on each show page as a guideline.
- 6. It's show time! On the day of the show we will ask you to help us collect some audience feedback (this is really important in helping us to secure our funding and continue to support shows like yours).
- 7. After the event. You will return a feedback form and we will invoice you for the relevant fee.







Ana has been on a journey. Croatian born, she's arrived in the UK, determined to make it home. As she focuses on life in this new land, she is haunted by the voice of her Grandma- calling for her to stay true to national identity and yearning for Ana to come home. As Grandma bakes her traditional Croatian pepper biscuits (believed to bring a loved one back home), will this be enough to be reunited with her granddaughter? But what is "home" to Ana now?

Written by Croatian playwright, Kristina Gavran, and performed by Croatian actor, Tina Hofman, Pepper & Honey is a poignant, subtle and timely play about the journey of change, cultural differences, and the conflict between upholding the traditions of the "old country" and embracing those of the new.

Originally devised in 2018, this story finds new resonance as the UK becomes home to people displaced by war and economic crisis. Pepper & Honey manages these challenging and often polarising issues with a heart-warming, personal approach, and speaks to the need for tolerance and the power of human connection.



Two Fools meet on the Drina Bridge, one to jump, the other to leap, but both are about to discover that this is no accidental meeting.

'Two Fools' sees two of Shakespeare's Fools meet on The Bridge over the Drina.

One Fool, Lear's Fool, has come to jump, the other Dogsberry has come to make a leap of faith, as represented in the Tarot. What follows is a discourse on the fool in theatre, religion and the fool in a society run by fools.

However, this is a story with dark undertones, as the Drina Bridge was notorious during the Balkan Wars as a place of mass execution. It transpires that this is no chance meeting and Dogberry is the secret policeman both in art and reality.

A pact is made and a challenge set. This absurd play has overtones of Godot and yet also plays homage to the great British tradition of comedy double acts of the straight man and comic.

A century of women's stories brought to life by Black Liver; this two-hander play takes us through the history of the last 100 years in a shop in a Lancashire town.


